



WHY?

- Khan Academy is a free online tool used to study for the SAT and any other subject.
- Students can receive personalized lessons when their Khan Academy account is linked to College Board (SAT) account.
- Khan Academy offers full-length SAT exams, allows students to create a study schedule for upcoming exams, and helps tutors keep track of their progress.
- Research shows that students who spent 20 hours on Khan Academy SAT increased their score on average by 115 points. Higher test scores lead to greater chances of receiving merit scholarships.

HOW?

- Create a Khan Academy account at KhanAcademy.org
- Create a College Board account at CollegeBoard.org
Tip: Don't make another account if you've made one before. You can retrieve the account if you've forgotten your username or password with your email (may be your school email).
- When creating an account, select "SAT" as one of the subjects you are interested in.
- Once you're in your dashboard, select "practice" in the SAT practice section.
- You will then be asked if you've taken a College Board exam before (SAT, PSAT & PSAT10). Select "Yes...". Move onto question 2.
- On question 2, choose "A. Sign into CollegeBoard".
- Sign into your College Board account and give Khan permission to retrieve your exam information for a personalized lesson plan.
